About the project

Forest Wind is a 1,200MW wind farm development that has the capacity to produce enough clean energy to power about 500,000 houses – that's 1 in 4 Queensland homes.

Forest Wind is proposed to be built within Australia's largest exotic pine plantation between Gympie and Maryborough. Forest Wind's location has been carefully selected and designed to minimise impacts on the landscape, environment, and community.

The project will deliver local construction and operational jobs, together with business opportunities for the Wide Bay community and broader region.

Forest Wind remains committed to delivering enduring economic, environmental, and social benefits for the broader community. We will continue to work closely with local residents, community and environmental groups, the region's First Nations people, local regional councils, the plantation timber industry and other key stakeholders throughout the project's design and construction phases.



Our new partner

Forest Wind's last update, released in February of this year, confirmed <u>Tilt Renewables</u>, a leading Australian renewable energy company, has acquired 50% of the Forest Wind project.

Tilt is proud to be a market-leading Australian owned and operated business that is driving the energy transition in Australia. Tilt joins the Forest Wind project with a proven record in renewable energy projects with ten already in operation or construction across Australia, as an integrated and innovative renewable energy business that aims to be reliable, responsible, and competitive.



Project update

Over the past twelve months, we have continued to collect wind, climate and environmental data from the project site. This data is being used to help inform the wind farm's design factors, which will include identifying any constraints relating to the locations of the wind turbines within Forest Wind's project area.

Over the next few months, we will continue conducting ecological, wind resource measurement, site design and optimisation, transport and logistics, and grid connection studies.

We are preparing an extensive report to provide additional information requested by the Commonwealth Department of Climate Change, Energy, the Environment and Water for assessment of Forest Wind under the *Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999*. There will be opportunity for public comment, and we will notify the community through this newsletter, advertisements in local papers and information on our website on where you can access this report and have your say.

Community engagement

Forest Wind remains committed to genuine engagement with key stakeholders.

Forest Wind Community Reference Group

In 2020, we established the Forest Wind Community Reference Group (FWCRG) with the aim of bringing together a diverse group of local representatives to:

- perform an advisory and consultative role to support the project's design,
- promote productive working relationships and information sharing between the project team and key stakeholder groups,
- provide a formal avenue for the Forest Wind project team to respond to the community's questions and concerns, and
- encourage input from the community to support the development of a community benefits sharing strategy.
